California Insurance Crisis Hits Atchison Village

Two months ago, we were informed by



our insurance broker that major insurance companies were abandoning the California insurance market for condos and

coops worth over \$20 million dollars (we are valued at over \$88 million). Travelers, our insurance company, was one of those companies and they informed us that they would not renew our insurance in February. Our broker also stated that he was having difficulty obtaining new insurance for his HOA and condominium clients and that comparable policies were running at between **two to six times the cost of the original premiums**. Our present premium is about \$200,000 per year.

On Jan 17 the Board held a Zoom meeting with the insurance broker. We discussed the idea of sub-dividing Atchison Village into zones and attempting to obtain several policies, each below the \$20-million limit, the possibility of raising our deductibles to reduce the premiums and even the possibility of, and pros and cons of self-insurance. Our broker is going to take all the information from our discussion and create bargaining positions to approach the insurance carriers that are still writing multifamily policies in California.

Beyond the work our broker is doing, Board members and our bookkeeper are sending communications to four new brokers requesting quotes. One of the brokers is a member of Atchison Village and he is exploring the possibility of working with an insurance company that has special rates for veterans in the hope that our status as a historic park might qualify us for special rates. Our bookkeeper is contacting agents from three major insurance carriers and is attempting to find out if there would be an advantage in working directly with insurance companies rather than a broker. Another AV member has been contacting government representatives and agencies for leads.

On Feb 7, 2024, we will hold a Community Outreach Meeting with our insurance broker present to share what our insurance broker is able to negotiate and report on our other research. Members will have the opportunity to ask questions. At the Feb 14 board meeting, the board is going to have to vote on what insurance packages we are going to purchase at the March board meeting, we will integrate insurance into our final budget.

We are preparing for the possibility that the insurance crisis in California is going to cause financial pain to members, we are doing everything we can do to keep you informed, to keep Atchison Village protected, and to mitigate the financial harm of this unfortunate situation.
