It is time to begin reporting trees that are dangerous or that need maintenance to the office. The annual tree walk will be held early September, and the tree committee will be evaluating the trees that you report with an arborist and/or tree pruning contractor.

The cost for pruning "street trees" planted by the city or Groundworks will be accepted by the Corporation. We also pay for pruning or removal of "heritage trees" 30 years or more.

We will arrange to prune and remove trees in backyards or planted by the member without a permit, but we will have to pass the cost onto the member. Photo: Chris Dunaway




Walk-Abouts Are Back

After a nine-year hiatus, Atchison Village walk-abouts will continue Monday, July 22 at 1:15 PM. We have hired a new half-time gardener, and we will cover every area (blocks 1-6) to inspect common areas and lawns. We will preview and then review the pruned areas so that we can create and evaluate standards for our grounds and common areas. Members are invited to accompany us and can meet us on Mondays at 1:15 in front of the Corporation building. We will also be recording yards that are overgrown, unkempt and a fire hazard, so you may be receiving a letter to clear vegetation or to cut your lawn after the walkabout in your area. You have 4 weeks to do this, and we will provide names of people in our community who you can hire to help. If you would like to be added to the list as a provider of yard care, please contact the office. If a member does not bring their yard into compliance within four weeks, the Corporation will do the work and charge both the cost of labor and a fine. – Ron Kane

AV Parking Committee: Parking Lot 11 Member Meeting

On July 9, 2024, the AV Parking Committee convened the stakeholders of Parking Lot 11 for a community meeting in Lot 11. Member representatives from at least 20 Units participated in the information-gathering session for about an hour. The Parking Committee listened to member concerns and strategized on improvements that could be made to increase security in that parking lot. If you are unfamiliar with Lot 11, it is the farthest part of AV on W. Macdonald near 1st Street. It has an automatic rolling gate and key-access pedestrian gates for the members with spots there to walk through.

The takeaways from the meeting: there are many caring and cooperative members who live on the frontlines of AV along W. Bissell and W. Macdonald; and our neighbors who park in Lot 11 are concerned with the operation and function of the rolling gate, the security of their yards and vehicles, their personal safety as they move in the parking lot and enter and exit the lot. The members who are assigned parking spots in Lot 11 look out for each other and just want to feel safe and secure. The AV Parking Committee plans to bring together more parking community meetings across the Village soon. We want to know what concerns members, and to include them in the conversation as we work to enact our parking policies throughout AV.
